はしがき

Reading Trek! は、世界各地の感動的な物語を厳選し、英語を学ぶ人たちへ向けて、人々の生き方や思いについて読み取り、英文を深く理解するためのエクササイズをつけて編纂したものです。選んだ物語は、アメリカ、イギリス、ドイツ、インド、タイ、ヨルダン、ジンバブエ、中国などを舞台にしており、文化、歴史、宗教、戦争と平和などに関わる様々な人の生き方が描かれています。

本書は15章構成で、各章は Match the Meanings, Discover the Story, Check Your Comprehension, Useful Expressions from the Story, Your Thoughts on the Story の5つのセクションで構成されています。物語の英文は、世界のライターによる原文を単語の難易度と構文の複雑さの観点から解析し、語彙の難易度も調整して再編集したものです。複雑すぎる構文は平易なものへと変更し、書き換えができない語には注をつけました。

本書の活動は、英語で読み進めるということを最重要目標としています。最初のウォームアップとなる語彙問題の Match the Meanings では、本文で使われている重要な語句について、英語での定義を合わせるという形式にしました。Discover the Story で物語を読んだあと、内容理解を問う Check Your Comprehension に進みます。問題は A, B, C の 3 つのパターンを準備しました。最初の問題 A では、物語の要点となる内容について英語の問いに英語で答える形式で、物語の概要を把握できるようになっています。問題 B は選択問題になっており、正確に詳細を理解できる力を養うためのものです。そして問題 C は真偽を答える問題で、英文全体の内容を深く把握するためのセクションです。次の Useful Expressions from the Story は空所補充問題で、英文で学んだ表現を確認し、しっかりと身につけるためのものです。最後に Your Thoughts on the Storyでは、英文読解を通じて自分が考えたことや感じたことについて英語で表現するという機会を設けました。考えを整理しやすいように、フォーマットが準備されています。物語について、気に入った点、心を動かされた点とその理由、そしてその物語が自分に与えた影響について書きます。この形式に慣れると、いつでも自分の考えや感想を英語で述べることができるようになるでしょう。

本書は、大学生の皆さんが、心が豊かになるような英語の物語に触れ、共感し、考え、楽しみながら学ぶことを願って作りました。一歩一歩自分の足で世界を旅するように、物語を通して皆さんの世界が広がっていくことを願っております。最後になりましたが、本書の作成にあたり金星堂の皆さんに多大なるご協力とご支援を賜りました。ここに謝意を表します。

Discover the Story



1 California-native Ben Underwood was just like any other American teenager: he loved to ride his bike, play basketball with his friends, rollerblade and play video games. The only thing he was missing was a pair of eyes.

2 Ben was only two years old when a rare form of cancer was found in both of
5 his eyes. In order to save his life, doctors had no choice but to remove them, which
obviously meant losing his sense of vision. When little Ben woke up from the
surgery, he was confused, so his mother put his hands on her face and said, "You
can't use your eyes anymore, but you have your hands, your nose and your ears."
She was determined to never be overprotective of her son, place any limits on him
10 or allow him to feel sorry for himself. She wanted him to live life freely and with a
positive attitude.

3 Soon, Ben started to develop a unique skill to get around his home and neighborhood safely. By making sharp clicking noises with his tongue and carefully listening to the sounds that bounced off nearby objects, such as tables and chairs at home, and trees, vehicles and buildings outside, he learned to "see" what was around him. It was a technique called echolocation, and is used by dolphins and bats, but rarely by humans.

4 By the time Ben was in his teens, he had mastered this ability so well that he could correctly tell one shape from another and name the number of small objects

placed in front of him without touching them. The skill helped him to enjoy his daily life in safety, since by quickly clicking with his tongue and hearing the echoes, he was
able to avoid objects while walking, riding his bike or skating on his rollerblades. Ben had a unique perspective on his situation: "I am not blind. I just can't see," he'd say.

30 **5** Ben's unusual talent and his positive feelings about life acted as




an inspiration to many. The active teenager appeared on a number of TV programs and in various magazines, traveling across the country and abroad, including to his favorite overseas country, Japan. Hoping to go to college there, he even started to teach himself Japanese.

6 However, at the age of 15, Ben's cancer returned. After a brave fight with the disease, on January 19, 2009—a week before his 17th birthday—Ben passed away at home, surrounded by his family. Although he is no longer on this earth, his story continues to inspire and touch the hearts of people around the world.
