## Foreword

World News Tonight with David Muir, the flagship news program of the American Broadcasting Company (ABC), is enjoyed by millions of Americans each evening at 6:30 p.m. It consistently ranks among the top-rated news programs in the United States, and for good reason. With its long history of fair and balanced reporting, the program covers issues that matter both domestically and internationally. A news broadcast not only has a responsibility to report events accurately, but also to set the agenda by deciding which stories deserve public attention. World News Tonight excels in both respects: It strives to present the news without bias while selecting topics that genuinely inform and engage the public. These qualities make it an ideal foundation for a news-based English textbook for students.

The publication of this textbook now spans over three decades, reflecting the ongoing desire of students to learn English through engaging, real-world content. From the hundreds of stories broadcast each year on *World News Tonight*, we have carefully selected fifteen recent and relevant reports for this edition. Special attention was given to choosing stories that are both engaging and varied, appealing to a wide range of learners. Topics range from fascinating technological breakthroughs, such as the cloning of the dire wolf, to the dramatic shutdown and restoration of the popular social media platform TikTok. There are moving human-interest stories, such as a lung donation that led to love, and urgent environmental issues, including the dangerous, so-called "zombie wells." With this range of meaningful topics and thoughtfully structured activities, we aim to help learners improve their English while also expanding their understanding of the world.

The textbook is organized so that learners can ease into each chapter by previewing gist questions and learning key vocabulary they will hear in the news story video. This vocabulary is carefully selected based on frequency, usefulness, and importance for understanding the story. The activities that follow each news story consolidate learning through comprehension checks and a variety of input and output activities. Each chapter concludes with interactive discussion questions that encourage learners to connect new knowledge with their own experiences and perspectives.

Adopting authentic broadcast news material for classroom use is a powerful way to build English skills while also developing awareness of world affairs and the critical thinking skills essential for young people in today's interconnected world. Because news language is often formal, much of its vocabulary overlaps with what appears on standardized tests such as the TOEFL and TOEIC, making it potentially useful as a supplementary resource for exam preparation.

We hope this textbook inspires you to stay informed about global events, think critically about the information you encounter, and engage more deeply with the world around you. Best wishes for your studies!

### まえがき

日常生活における情報源として、インターネットやAIの活用が年代を問わず欠かせないツールとなっている。このような高度な情報化社会では、不正確な情報や見方の偏った情報も多くあふれている。学生諸君は、何が本当に自分に役立つ正しい情報か、情報の「質」を見極める能力を身につける必要があるのではないだろうか。

一般的に、テレビニュースからの情報は信頼性が高いといわれている。本書はアメリカの3大ネットワーク(ABC/CBS/NBC)の一つである、ABC放送からのテレビニュースを文字化した上で、テキスト用に編集したものである。収録したニュースは米国東部標準時間夕方6時30分から毎日放送されているABC放送の看板ニュース番組World News Tonight with David Muirである。

1948年に始まり、長い歴史を誇るこのABC放送のニュース番組は、ピーター・ジェニングズなど、多くの人気キャスターを生み出してきた。2014年にディビッド・ミューアがアンカーパーソンに抜擢され、さらに人気が高まった。2015年3月には「アメリカで最も多く視聴されている夕方のニュース番組」となり、アメリカ国内でも絶大な人気を保ちながら、質の高い情報を毎日提供し続けている。

今回もそのABC放送の看板番組の中から、大学生が学ぶにふさわしい多種多様なニュースを15本厳選し、収録することができた。「メタ社、ファクトチェッ

クプログラムを終了」「卵の価格が高騰」など、本書で取り上げた現代社会が 抱えるさまざまなトピックを学ぶことを通じて、学生諸君にはニュースの理解 を深めながら自分の意見も持ってもらいたい。また、「アマゾンの自然を守る」 や「放棄された井戸から有害ガス」など、世界共通の課題である環境問題を学 べるものも含まれている。身近で親しみやすい話題としては、「アメリカ製の マグが人気」、考えさせられる話題としては、「肺移植がもたらした運命の出会 い」なども収録した。

ニュースを収録した映像は、専用のウェブサイトplus+Media上でストリーミング視聴することができる。ぜひ、学生諸君にはこの映像を繰り返し見てもらいたい。アメリカの人々が家庭で毎日見ている良質のニュース番組に触れ、信頼できる情報をもとに英語を学んでもらいたい。

本書は1987年にTV News from the U.S.A.として始まった。その後、ABC World News、Broadcast: ABC WORLD NEWS TONIGHT、そしてABC NEWSROOMと 改良を重ねたロングシリーズとなっている。アメリカABC放送のニュースを利用した本シリーズは今回で通算33冊目になり、お陰様で長年にわたり毎回たいへん好評を頂いている。今後もより良い教材開発の努力を続けていきたい。

最後になったが、テキスト作成に際して毎回大変お世話になっている金星堂の みなさん、今回もこころよく版権を許可してくださったアメリカABC放送に心 から感謝の意を表したい。
